An ad hoc committee will plan and conduct an interactive public workshop featuring presentations and discussions that highlight efforts made to scale program investments across health, education, nutrition, and social protection that aim to improve children’s developmental potential. Speakers will explore four topics around scaling up program investments: (1) evidence of impact

for effective models; (2) scalability of program models; (3) sustainability of programs; and (4) governance. A set of research presentations will synthesize up-to-date evidence on effective programs and interventions in Latin America and other regions, including an account of their strengths and challenges. Speakers will address scalability and sustainability of program investments and how to maintain quality at scale, with a focus on approaches in culturally and ethnically diverse contexts and issues of decentralization, local capacity and information systems for monitoring and evaluation. Presentations and discussions will include the perspectives and experiences of policymakers and ministers who have scaled up programs and worked toward implementing early childhood services into a comprehensive national policy.
